Information about Chronic Kidney Disease

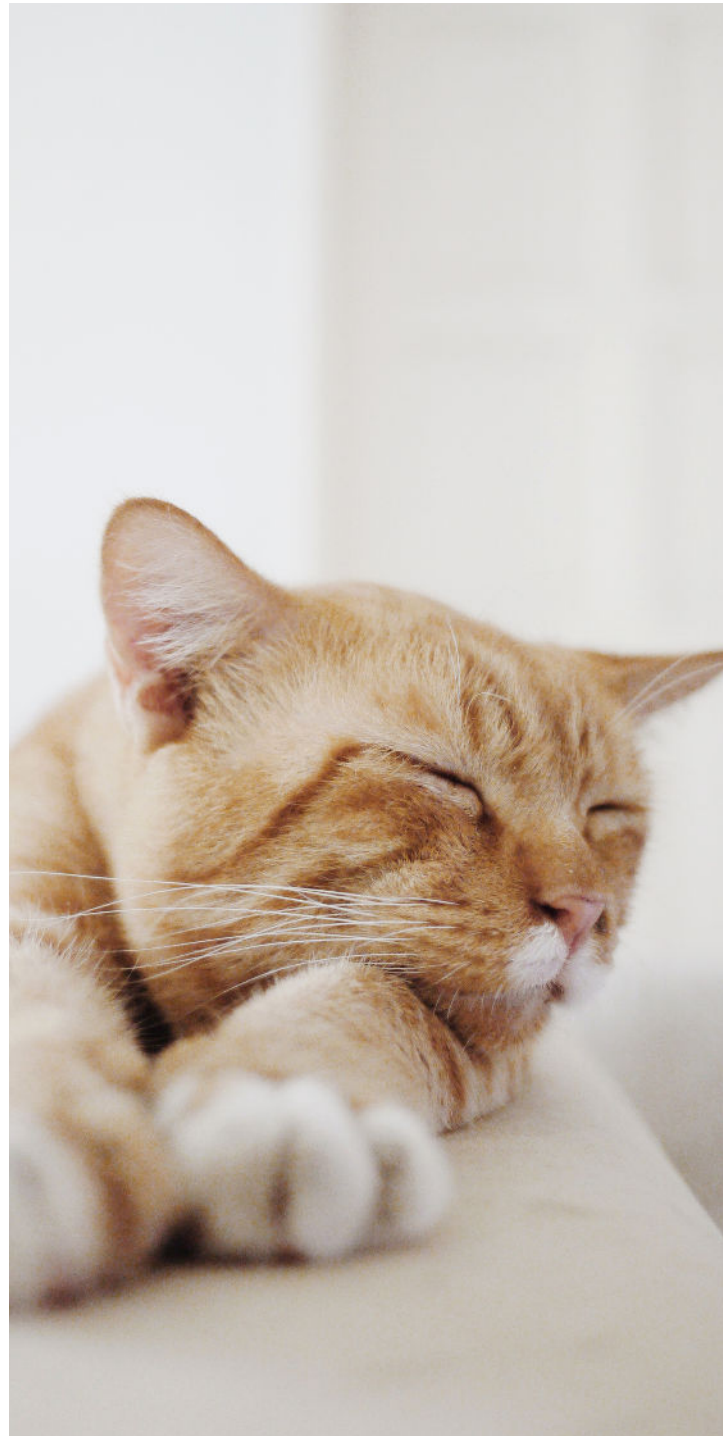
Signs of Chronic Kidney Disease include lethargy, weight loss and dehydration.

Chronic kidney disease in cats can be due to many different causes but most commonly there is not an underlying cause found.

Treatment for the renal disease involves a dietary change to a diet that is designed to aid kidney function as well as medications to regulate phosphorous intake and blood flow to the kidneys.

Your cat will need to have ongoing blood tests to check the kidney function and ensure that the medications and diet are working.

If you're concerned your pet has Chronic Kidney Disease or has serious vomiting and diarrhoea please seek veterinary attention early.
